

ARGUMENT:

Sensitive areas are among those that have long experienced and continue to experience several problems and difficulties, due to their distinctive natural features, which make up a harmonious geographical, economic, and social entity, and a particular urban structure that includes cities, centres, and small towns, which are subject to a constant exodus of population.

According to law 01–20 on land use planning and sustainable development (mountainous areas, coastal areas, border areas, desert areas), as sensitive areas that need to be taken into account in terms of attention to the living conditions of the population, the identification of additional actions necessary for their protection, the development of living centres and the establishment of the facilities and services necessary for life in these areas, the elimination of isolation by improving transport and telecommunications networks and the better use of local resources by developing traditional industries, tourism and recreational activities appropriate to the local economy of these regions. They will be promoted and benefit from all the measures allocated to them under this law.

The development of sensitive areas, through national programs, is still trying to make them an integral part, but it must be recognised that they are distinctive "sensitive" areas due to their geographical reality and natural influences, as they are among the areas that are undoubtedly experiencing the phenomenon of urbanisation and development, which is not negligible in maintaining the balance of the urban network of the national territory.

Urban and regional planning instruments, particularly national and regional development and planning plans, have attempted to take account of the development and planning prospects of these areas at various levels by promoting urban centers, strengthening basic infrastructure in these areas and encouraging population stability in these areas. The government has also endeavored, through the administrative division, to increase the number of municipalities in these special zones in order to better control these areas.
